



NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

As a public service, the City of Los Angeles will provide you with the following information upon request:

- Whether a property is in or out of the Flood Hazard Area (FHA) as shown on the current Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) of the County.
- Additional flood insurance data for a site, such as the FIRM zone and the base flood elevation or depth, if shown on the FIRM.
- We have a handout on the flood insurance purchase requirement that can help people who need a mortgage or loan for a property in the SFHA.
- The City maintains elevation certificates for new and substantially improved structures in the SFHA.
- The City updates the Flood Insurance Rate Maps as needed when revisions are made to the maps.
- The City also has information for additional FIRM information, problems not shown on the FIRM, flood depth date, special flood related hazards, historical flood information, natural floodplain functions.

- The City has earned a Community Rating System score of 7. A total of 15% insurance premium discount applies to all new and renewed flood insurance policies in Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA) only within the City of Los Angeles. All flood insurance properties outside SFHAs continue to have a 5% discount.
- As a participant in the NFIP, the City is required to produce a 5-year Floodplain Management Plan Update which will be available in late 2015. To help us prepare the report a survey site has been established to determine and assess the needs of the public relating to flooding in their neighborhood at the link: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/LACity/FloodSurvey>.
